



INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS: HARLEY-DAVIDSON TOURING OVERSIZED 450 DESTROYER SLIP-ONS PART# 16553/16555/46553








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TOOLS REQUIRED





STOCK EXHAUST SYSTEM REMOVAL

- 1. Remove both left and right saddlebags and set them aside.
- 2. Loosen the bolt from the pinch clamp on the front end of each muffler.
- 3. Remove the two 5/16" bolts that mount the muffler to the saddlebag supports. Repeat this step on the opposite muffler.
- **4.** Remove the stock mufflers and set them aside. **NOTE:** It may be necessary to use a penetrating lubricant to loosen the muffler from the head pipe.
- 5. Leaving the grommets in place, remove the stock mounting brackets from the rubber grommets located on the saddle supports. NOTE: Inspect the grommets to verify that they are in good condition, if the grommets are damaged they will need to be replaced.

VANCE & HINES EXHAUST INSTALLATION

- 1. Install the muffler mount brackets into grommets. Mount bracket (3) goes on the rights side and mount bracket (4) goes on the left side.
- 2. Install Torca clamps (5) onto each muffler inlet so that the Torca clamp bolt is to the inside and the nut is facing down. (Figure 1)
- 3. Slide the right side muffler on. **NOTE:** Dent will be on the inside.
- 4. Slide nut plates inside the tent brackets welded to backside of the mufflers bodies and attach the muffler to the muffler support bracket using two 5/16"-18 flange bolts (6). Finger tighten only. (Figure 2)
- 5. Repeat installation procedure for the opposite muffler.
- 6. Align mufflers bodies then torque the Torca band clamps to 40-44 ft. lbs. Slide the muffler support bracket as far as possible before tightening the two flange bolts. After alignment torque the bolts to 18 ft. lbs.
- 7. Replace the saddlebags.
- **8.** After installation and before starting the motorcycle, completely clean chrome mufflers with cleaning solvent and a clean, soft cloth that will not leave any residue. Before starting the motorcycle with black mufflers thoroughly clean them with warm soapy water and a soft cloth. **NOTE**: Any residue, oil, or fingerprints will stain the chrome when the metal heats up.
- **9**. Be sure to tighten all hardware before starting your motorcycle.
- **10**. **IMPORTANT:** After test ride let pipes cool down and retorque muffler band clamps.


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EXHAUST CARE

- 1. When installing a new set of chrome pipes, make sure your hands are clean and free of oil. After installation, thoroughly clean pipes with a soft cloth and cleaning solvent that will leave no residue (chrome wax/polish, glass cleaner, alcohol, ammonia, etc...) before starting the motorcycle.
- 2. Avoid long periods of idling as this can cause discoloration.
- 3. Intake leaks can cause the engine to run lean and overheat, this could lead to discoloration.
- 4. Make sure there are no exhaust leaks at the junction of the exhaust pipes and cylinder head. We recommend replacing gaskets if they are worn.

EXHAUST CARE (BLACK)

- 1. When installing a new set of black pipes, make sure your hands are clean and free of oil. After installation, thoroughly clean pipes with warm soapy water and a soft cloth. Dry with a clean towel to remove any residue before starting the motorcycle. Do NOT use anything abrasive to clean the pipes.
- 2. Avoid long periods of idling as this can cause discoloration.
- 3. Intake leaks can cause the engine to run lean and overheat, this could lead to discoloration.
- **4.** Make sure there are no exhaust leaks at the junction of the exhaust pipes and the cylinder head. We recommend replacing gaskets if they are worn.
