



## STOCK EXHAUST SYSTEM REMOVAL


- 1. Remove both saddlebags and set them aside.
- 2. Loosen the bolt from the pinch clamp on the front end of each muffler.
- 3. Working with one muffler at a time, support the muffler (assistance may be required) while removing the 5/16" bolts from the saddlebag support and slide muffler off of the head pipe. Save the bolts for re-use.
- **4.** Repeat the process for the opposite muffler. **NOTE**: It may be necessary to use a penetrating lubricant to loosen the muffler from the head pipe.

### **VANCE & HINES EXHAUST INSTALLATION**

- 1. Install the 1.9" band clamp, item 3, over the front of the left and right muffler so that the bolt is to the inside and the nut is facing down (Figure 1). NOTE: New band clamps are supplied, do not use old band clamps.
- 2. Install the muffler by sliding it on to the head pipe and bolting it to the saddlebag support using the stock 5/16" bolts.
- 3. Repeat installation procedure for the opposite muffler.
- **4.** Align the mufflers and tighten the hardware, beginning with the 5/16" bolts on the mounting brackets as followed by the band clamp. Tighten 5/16" bolts to factory specifications and the band clamp to 40-45 Ft./Lbs.
- **5**. Replace the saddlebags.
- **6**. After installation and before starting the motorcycle, completely clean pipes and mufflers with soapy water and a clean, soft cloth that will not leave a residue. **NOTE:** Any residue, oil, or fingerprints will stain the finish when the metal heats up.

7. Be sure to tighten all hardware before starting your motorcycle.

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# **EXHAUST CARE (CHROME)**

- 1. When installing a new set of chrome pipes, make sure your hands are clean and free of oil. After installation, thoroughly clean pipes with a soft cloth and cleaning solvent that will leave no residue (chrome wax / polish, glass cleaner, alcohol, ammonia, etc...) before starting the motorcycle. Dry with a clean towel to remove any residue before starting the motorcycle.
- 2. Avoid long periods of idling as this can cause discoloration.
- **3.** Intake leaks can cause the engine to run lean and overheat, this could lead to discoloration.
- **4.** Make sure there are no exhaust leaks at the junction of the exhaust pipes and the cylinder head. We recommend replacing gaskets if they are worn.

# **EXHAUST CARE (BLACK)**

- When installing a new set of black pipes, make sure your hands are clean and free of oil. After installation, thoroughly clean pipes with warm soapy water and a soft cloth. Dry with a clean towel to remove any residue before starting the motorcycle. Do NOT use anything abrasive to clean the pipes.
- 2. Avoid long periods of idling as this can cause discoloration.
- 3. Intake leaks can cause the engine to run lean and overheat, this could lead to discoloration.
- **4.** Make sure there are no exhaust leaks at the junction of the exhaust pipes and the cylinder head. We recommend replacing gaskets if they are worn.

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### Emissions Notice:
